OUR TENTH ANNIVERSARY HONOREE IS JEAN FOLEY DOYLE

As the Newburyport Literary Festival celebrates its 10th anniversary, we are delighted to honor one of our own local luminaries, Jean Doyle. Jean, mother of seven, Newburyport High School history teacher for 30 years, is a local historian and lifetime Newburyport observer. She has drawn on American history and specifically Newburyport history to guide her classroom curriculum and her personal interests. Most recently her two-volume *History of Newburyport in the 20th Century* takes readers from 1900 to 1950 in the first volume and from 1950 to 1985 in the second.

OPENING NIGHT — Our festival's opening night features a conversation between Michael Blanding, best-selling author, journalist, historian and local journalist Dyke Hendrickson. The topic is *The Map Thief*, the story of an infamous crime, a revered map dealer with an unsavory secret, and the ruthless subculture that consumed him.

Dyke Hendrickson is a veteran reporter, now with the *Daily News*. He is an author himself and admirer of Blanding's achievement in writing *The Map Thief*.
